It seems that Pat was visiting an area where most of the baggage fell, at a 800 acre sheep farm owned by Richard Temple. Richard approached Pat and asked if she was from the U.S.A. He had found some pictures in his field in the spring that had been pushed up by the frost. He had seen the S. U. sweatshirts in the pictures and asked Pat if she would make sure they got back to Syracuse University and to the proper families, knowing that if he gave them to the authorities, they may not get to the families.

I would have sent them sooner, but it took quite a while to have negatives made from the original prints.
