Message from the Dean

This past academic year, Syracuse University Libraries ranked #54 out of the 120 institutions in the Association of Research Libraries Investment Index. This ranking marks a continued improvement over the past decade; it is a testament to our excellent library staff and to the investment that the University makes in our library system. For that I am both very grateful and proud.

Notable in this year's annual report is a focus on library spaces as a service. Our students, faculty and staff are not only taking advantage of our communal and collaborative spaces, but they are also using individual, group and long-term study rooms, alongside new wellness spaces such as the MindSpa massage chair room and the prayer and meditation room. The Mower Faculty Commons on the 5th floor of Bird Library has seen faculty usage increase by 75% over last year, with over 400 individual faculty members having visited the space at least once.

Our service improvements are online as well as on site. At the end of this academic year, the Libraries launched its new integrated library services platform, a cloud-based enterprise system replacing a locally hosted solution we had used for more than 25 years. Change is disruptive, even when it is for the better, and I am very appreciative of the many months of collegial, collaborative work across many parts of the library that led to a successful launch in June 2024. Work on the new system continues, and we look forward to its more robust reporting capabilities for future annual reports.




Hawkins Building on lamesville Avenue is home to University Records Management and houses materials from the collections.
