Message from the Dean

The Libraries' annual report allows us to share the progress we've made over the course of the year "by the numbers," underscoring the impact that the SU Libraries has on our student-focused research university that is welcoming to all. The more qualitative stories of our impact can be seen regularly on social media, on our website, in SU News and in our biannual *Connection* magazine.

There are a few items I'd like to bring to your attention as you review our FY'25 report:

- We continue to excel in various areas; to name just a few, interlibrary loan is locally appreciated and nationally recognized; the Mower Faculty Commons has clearly found its community of users; and our multiple study and wellness spaces are used many thousands of times a year.
- Both the SU Press and our open-access publishing efforts are carrying the SU academic brand out into the world on scale.
- The LaunchPad is firmly established as the campus hub for entrepreneurs, innovators and creatives.
- We are more deeply embedded than ever in the curricular life of the University, with research courses and guides, reference help in person and online, multiple class sessions in Special Collections, and 18 library staff (including me) teaching 32 courses as instructors or adjunct professors.

Our excellence is being recognized by our peers: I'm excited to share that last year Syracuse ranked 53 out of the 118 top public, private and governmental research libraries in North America, improving 30 positions across the past decade!

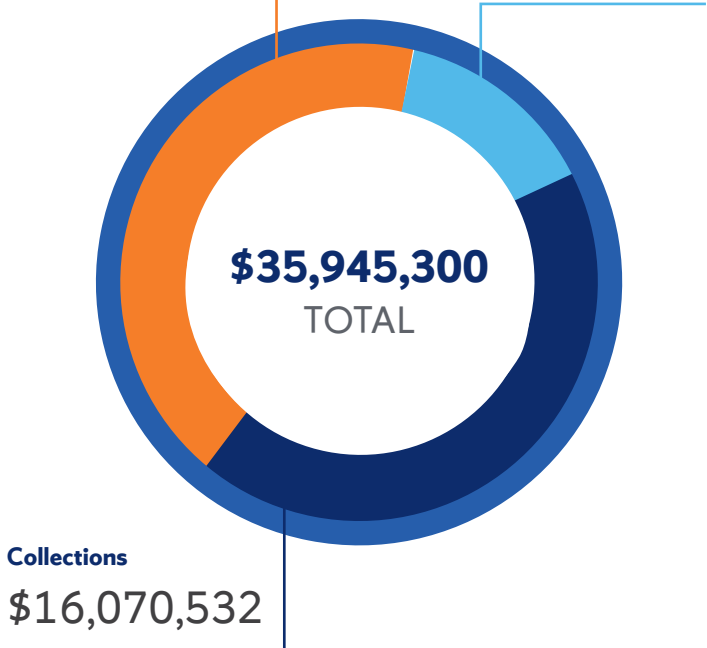

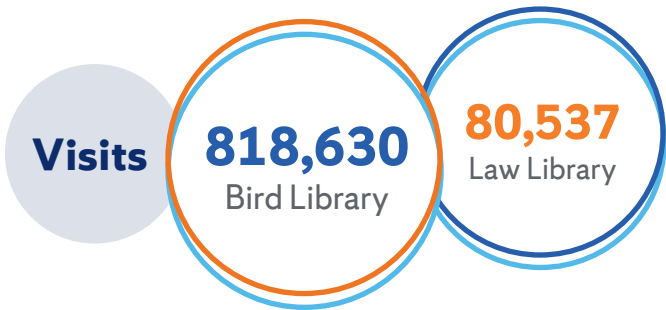
